Dear Parent/Carer

Arriving at school promptly not only sets a positive tone for the day but also helps to develop important life skills that will benefit them in the long run.

By arriving on time, students can fully participate in the morning routine of either an assembly, form time or interventions, ensuring they do not miss out on valuable learning experiences. Arriving at school on time helps students establish a healthy routine, promoting self-discipline and time management skills that are important for your child's overall personal development. Punctuality also demonstrates respect for others' time, including teachers, other students, and school staff. It fosters a sense of responsibility and consideration for the wellbeing of the entire school community. Late arrivals can disrupt the flow of learning and can cause distractions for both teachers and students. By being on time, students contribute to a supportive learning environment where everyone can focus and engage effectively.

We understand that unforeseen circumstances may arise from time to time, leading to occasional lateness. However, consistent efforts to prioritise punctuality sends a powerful message to our students about the importance of responsibility and accountability. If your child is late to school you will be notified and your child will receive a sanction and a payback, unless there is a valid reason and school are notified of the reason by the Parent/Carer.

We appreciate your support in reinforcing the value of punctuality at home. By working together, we can help our students develop the habits and skills they need to thrive at school and beyond.
